



# ML's Greenery in Motion 2019 Custom Growing List



What matters to you about growing veggies and flowers? That's the real question of course because that's where the energy comes from to make it happen. Your eyes and your taste buds can tell you so much about the living world – learn to use them!!



For us (my sister and me), it's the absolute flavor difference in the tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, squashes, the electric colors in the zinnias, the steadfastness of the marigolds, the pleasure of watching the bees and butterflies swarm the phlox, the knowledge that the plants and animals that share the farm with us are as healthy as it's possible for them to be.

Food as medicine. Food as community. Food is the only substance that can sustain life through time. Every animal of any kind (you/me, dogs/cats, goats/ducks etc.), needs to eat quality food on a regular basis in order to maintain any quality of life. These are the reasons to know how to grow food, how to buy quality food, how to cook food. Industrialized food is easy and can keep you alive but can it support you to be your best? Of course these are HUGE issues deep in our culture – come to the farmer's market and we can talk about them.

All of the plants on this list serve these goals. If you haven't tried a horn pepper yet then you really have to. That's where the real flavor is in the pepper world. Try the different color tomatoes. They really can't be described accurately. How about the summer squashes? Did you know that the Italians really care about FLAVOR in summer squashes and that they make for GREAT eating? Each chard or kale has a subtly different flavor – never mind the rosemary and the basil.

Grow a torch plant (Tithonia), a butterfly weed (Asclepias), a mountain mint (Pycnanthemum) and just watch who comes to visit. And you can cut all of them to make bouquets for the table. See how long you can keep your zinnias going – all of the late flying insects use them in October. Not much else can hold that deep into the season and still provide pollen and nectar. Fertilize the plants one sunny day and watch the surge in insects the next day as the energy in the plant comes up.



Enjoy poking through this list – all plants are inoculated with a complex mix of rhizosphere microbes at seeding or transplanting and all get a re-inoculation just before you pick them up. I'll also have the high energy mineral/fertilizer mix available again this year in 30 lb. buckets. Add it to the plant list if you want to pick one up with your plants. ***Italicised and bold prices are packs***, upright prices are pots.

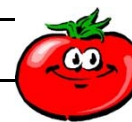
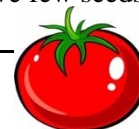
